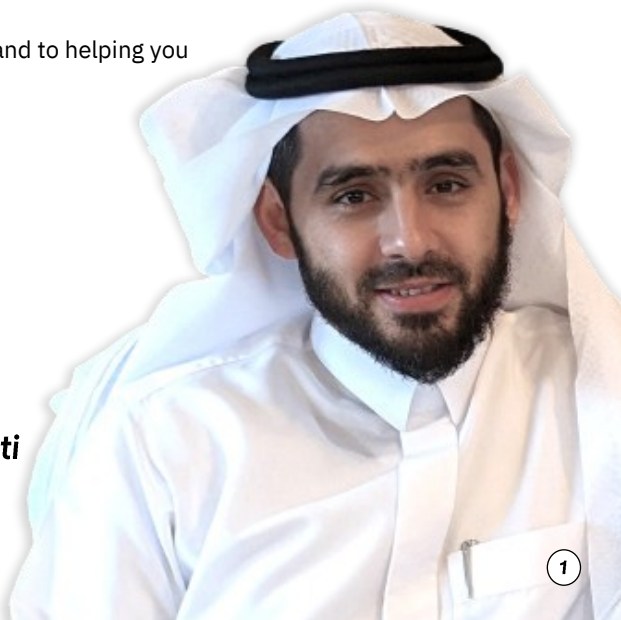

General Policies

Important

All students admitted into the PYP must **finish** the program within **one academic year**, including the **summer** term.

****Note:** A“DN” or “No Show” may affect the continuation status at KFUPM.

Skip-Prep

At the beginning of the **first semester**, students are promoted to **freshman year** if they meet the English proficiency requirement (IELTS/TOEFL) and pass the Math002 Promotion Exam (see page 7). All PYP courses, including modular courses, will then be waived.

Bridging Program

At the beginning of the **first semester**, students who **skipped Prep-English** can fast-track their PYP requirements while beginning to earn freshman-level credits. They will be enrolled in **Math012**, **PE001**, and **ENGL101** by default, plus another one general freshman course of their choice (see page 8).

One-Term Track

At the **start of the second semester**, students who have successfully completed **ENGL020/ENGL021** and **Math012** are promoted to **freshman year**. All remaining PYP courses, including the **two** modular courses for the second semester, will be waived.

Regular Track

By the **end of the second semester**, students are expected to complete **all PYP courses**, as shown in the program plans (see page 10), to advance to freshman year.



PYP Pathway



Orientation Week

All students will take **Math Placement test** to determine the students' starting Math level in the first semester.

University TOEFL Exam

English level placement will be determined by taking the TOEFL Exam, based on **TOEFL scores** that match the placement criteria. (see page 5)



Two Chances to Pass

Students have up to **two attempts** to pass any PYP course. Failing two ENGL, MATH, or PYP courses **twice** leads to **Dismissal**.

End of First Semester: Promotion Examinations

Students who got **A+ in Math001** can take **Math002 Promotion Exam**. Similarly, students with an **A+ in ENGL010** can take **TOEFL Promotion Exam**.



Summer Term

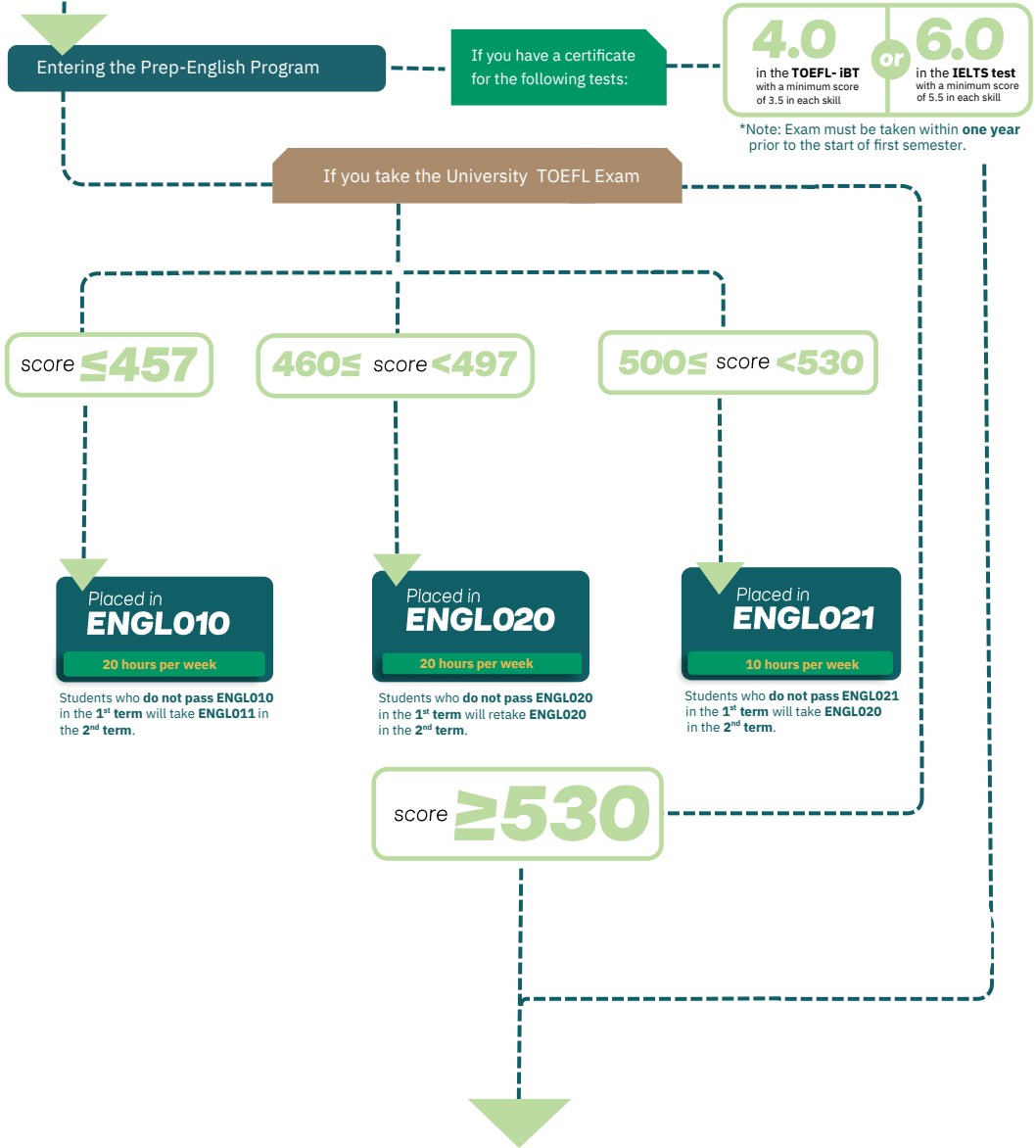
By the end of the second semester, students who have not passed **ENGL020** must enroll in **ENGL021** for the summer term (this also applies to students who pass ENGL011). Similarly, students who have not completed **MATH002** will be required to repeat the course.

Conditional Readmission

Students who fail **ENGL021** in the summer term, can be readmitted before the start of **second semester** of the following **academic year** if they already passed all PMP and PSEP courses and submit a valid **TOEFL or IELTS certificate**.

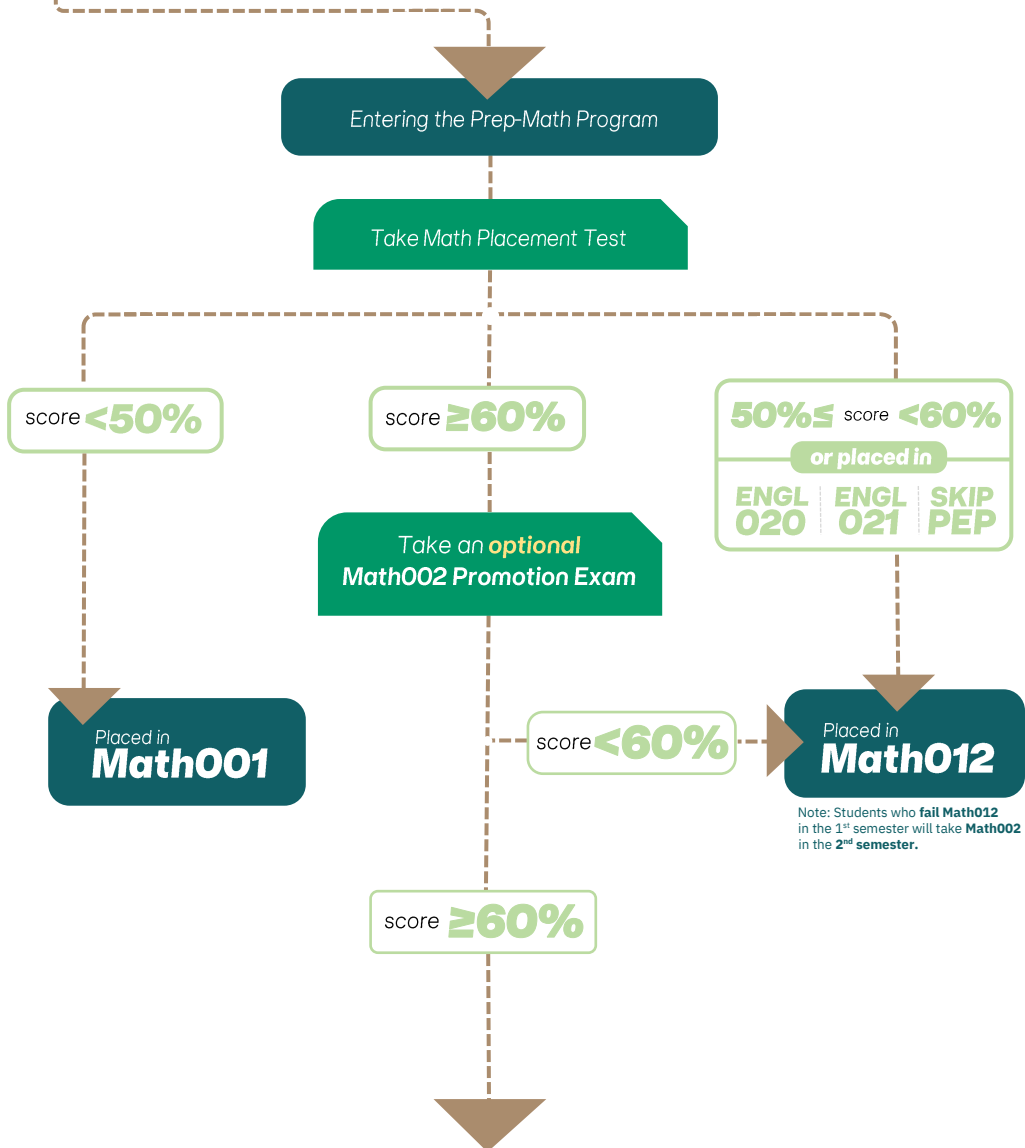


Prep-English Program Promotion Map

Skip Prep

The **PYP** supports **outstanding students** in saving time and effort through the **Skip-Prep** program. This allows students to **start their major directly** at the **beginning of the academic year**.

Skipping Prep-English

If you have a certificate for the following English Tests:

4.0 in the **TOEFL- iBT** Examination

with a minimum score of **3.5** in each skill and it must be taken within **1 year** prior to the start of the **1st semester**.

or

6.0 in the **IELTS** Examination

with a minimum score of **5.5** in each skill and it must be taken within **1 year** prior to the start of the **1st semester**.

or

If your **TOEFL-ITP** score from the PYP at the **start** of the **Academic Year** is:

≥530

on the **TOEFL-ITP** administered by the University during the **Orientation Week**.

Skipping Prep-Math

Students must meet the score requirements for both the **placement and promotion exams** to be able to skip the Prep-Math courses:

PMP Placement Exam

60%
or above

Math002 Promotion Exam

60%
or above

**Partial completion of these requirements allows partial skipping of the Prep-Year Program.

For Students Who Skip Prep-English: **Bridging Program**

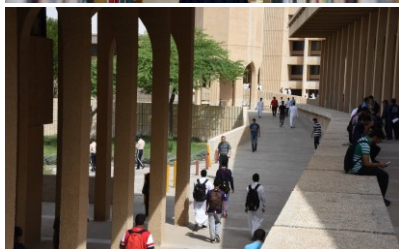
